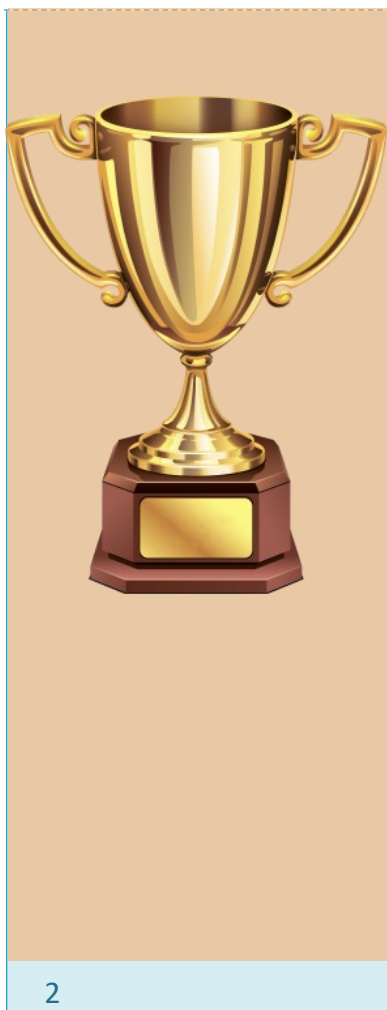


VE DAY CELEBRATIONS

Morris dancing is a traditional English folk dance performed by a group, often men, with distinctive stepping patterns and often accompanied by music and bells. Morris dancers are also associated with May Day. This traditionally marks the beginning of summer, halfway between the spring equinox and summer solstice.
